Obituary

Mr. Henry A. Dillon, Sr.

1901 - 1996

Mr. Henry A. Dillon, Sr., born on June 30, 1901 in Magnolia, Mississippi, the son of the late Thomas and Angeline Dillon, departed this life on Monday, April 29, 1996 at Methodist Memorial Hospital in New Orleans, Louisiana. He graduated from Tangipohoa Parish Training School, (Now O. E. Dillon High School), and received his baccalaureate degree in Agriculture from Southern University in Baton Rouge.

He was a devoted and dedicated public school teacher and principal. While serving as principal of Morehouse Training School in Bastrop, Louisiana he met and married Magnolia Williams. From this union three children were born, Henry A. Jr., Don and Joyce Dillon. For the next 40 plus years, he taught school and/or was principal at Kentwood, Bastrop, Oakdale, Ferriday, and Waterproof, Louisiana.

Henry A. Dillon was the driving force behind the successful voter registration drive during the 1950's and 1960's in Tensas Parish.

He belonged to many organizations, including the Tensas Chapter of the Southern University Alumni Federation, a Charter member of the Men of Distinction, The Trail Blazer Club, Phi Beta Sigma Fraternity, Inc., Southern University Quarterback Club, Scottish Rite Pride of Waterproof, No. 138 and the Louisiana State Retired Teachers Association. After moving to Baton Rouge, he joined Mount Pilgrim Baptist Church.

Henry A. Dillon was a devoted father and leaves to honor and cherish his memory his four children, Henry A Jr., Don, Melbourne, and Joyce Dillon Holley; daughters-in-law, Agnes St. Ann Dillon and Barbara Lee Dillon; and a son-in-law, Timothy Holley, Sr.; twenty grandchildren; twenty-nine great-grandchildren; a host of other nieces, nephews, relatives and friends.

He was preceded in death by his wife of sixty-four years, Magnolia Williams Dillon.
