He received his early education in the public schools of Pike County and was graduated from South McComb High School. After High School, his education was interrupted by three and one-half years of military service. He then attended Tougaloo College, where he received a Bachelor's Degree. He later attended Fisk University, Tuskegee Institute and the University of Southern Mississippi.

Mr. Dillon was employed as a teacher in the Columbia Public School System, the Hollandale Attendance Center and the Laurel City School System.

At an early age, he united with the Society Hill Baptist Church of McComb, Mississippi. After moving to Laurel, he joined St. Paul United Methodist Church, where he served faithfully as a member of the church choir, an active member of the United Methodist Men, Church School Superintendent, Sunday School Teacher, Lay Speaker and Lay Leader.
